Mohave County Attorney's Office Announces Sentencing in Aggravated Assault Case

On March 14, 2025, Defendant Brice Dean Rogers was sentenced to 2.5 years prison in the Arizona Department of Corrections following his convictions on two counts of aggravated assault by domestic violence. The guilty verdicts were delivered on January 23, 2025, after a jury trial held in Kingman, Arizona.

The jury trial and sentencing were presided over by Judge Billy K. Sipe. Despite Rogers being a first-time offender, Judge Sipe determined that probation was not a suitable option in this case. Through this decision, Judge Sipe sent a clear and powerful message to Mohave County: assaults, particularly those involving domestic violence, will not be treated lightly. The 2.5-year sentence reflects the seriousness of the offense and underscores the Mohave County Attorney's Office's commitment to protecting the community and upholding justice for victims.

"We commend Judge Sipe for his resolute stance in this case," said Matthew Houston, the Deputy County Attorney who prosecuted this case to trial. "His ruling ensures accountability and serves as a deterrent to others, while delivering justice to both the victim and the community at large."

The Mohave County Attorney's Office also extends its gratitude to the Lake Havasu Police Department for their exceptional work in investigating this case. Special recognition is due to Officer Jason Zuege, whose dedication, efforts, and compelling testimony at trial were instrumental in securing this conviction.

The Mohave County Attorney's Office remains committed to pursuing justice and supporting law enforcement efforts to keep our communities safe.
