KINGMAN MAN SENTENCED TO 37 YEARS IN PRISON FOR DANGEROUS CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN

Mohave County Superior Court Judge Lee F. Jantzen sentenced Scott William Dickinson Jr., of Kingman, to 37 years in prison on Friday, December 12, 2025, pursuant to a stipulated plea agreement. In October, Dickinson pleaded Guilty to one count of Sexual Conduct with a Minor Under Twelve, one count of Sexual Exploitation of a Minor, and two counts of Attempted Sexual Exploitation of a Minor, each a Dangerous Crime Against Children. On Friday, December 12, 2025, Dickinson received a 37-year prison sentence, of which he must serve every single day. After his 37-year sentence is served, he will then be on supervised probation for the remainder of his life. These convictions also include the requirement that he register as a sex offender.

Deputy County Attorney Karolina J. Czaplinska addressed the Court during the sentencing explaining the appropriateness of the harsh plea offered, given the immense suffering of the victims and the nature of the crimes committed. The Victim Representative read what Judge Jantzen characterized as a “gut-wrenching” Victim Impact Statement. The Court found the plea and resulting sentence – pursuant to which Dickinson will remain in prison until he is over 80 years old – to be appropriate in consideration of the many aggravating factors present in the offenses.

The Mohave County Attorney's Office commends the Mohave County Sheriff's Office, including Detective Michael Angelo, whose hard work and ingenuity investigating crimes involving electronics and child exploitation lead to the discovery of overwhelming evidence of Dickinson's guilt, and ensured justice was served for the Victims. The County Attorney's Office also extends a special thanks to Homeland Security Investigations agents and the Metropolitan Police Service of England who liaised with and assisted local law enforcement during the course of this investigation.

The County Attorney's Office would also like to thank Inez Knox of the Victim Witness Division of the MCAO, for assisting the Victims in navigating the complex criminal justice system and obtaining lifetime protective orders against Dickinson. The County Attorney's Office also extends a very gracious thanks to Kingman Aid to Abused People (KAAP) for their assistance in this case.
